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



about the history

ABOUT THE GREEK MYTHOLOGY

Clytemenstra (Clementine) is married to Agamemnon, ruler of the kingdom of Mycenae or Argos. Agamemnon sacrifices their daughter, Iphigenia, to the gods and Clytemnestra is furious. In revenge, she kills both him and his chosen spoils of war, the Trojan princess and Oracle, Cassandra.

Medea (Maddy) is a sorceress who marries the hero Jason. Jason leaves her for a strategic marriage with a younger Princess, and in revenge Medea kills their children.

Antigone (Antonia) is the daughter and sister to Oedipus by his mother, Jocasta. She nobly seeks a sacred burial for her slain brother, despite the demands of her uncle, King Creon. In response, Creon orders Antigone to be buried alive in a tomb.

Cassandra refuses the sexual advances of Apollo, and in return receives the gift of prophecy and the curse to never be believed. She meets her demise after the Trojan War when she is taken as a concubine by King Agamemnon. On his return home, both he and Cassandra are murdered by his wife, Clytemnestra.

Apollo is one of the most central and complicated Greek gods; he is the patron of Delphi, the god of prophecy, and the leader of the Muses, among other things.

ABOUT EMILY POST

Etiquette: The Blue Book of Social Usage Published by Emily Post in May 1945, the dust jacket reads:

"A complete guide to good manners and good taste for the entire family. Emily Post, the supreme authority, answers all your questions about the socially acceptable thing to do and how to do it - in any situation and on any occasion."

PILL-POPPING HOUSEWIVES

So which pills exactly were being popped? In the context of *BLISS*, our girls were likely taking Valium or some other similar tranquilizer. Following the drug Miltown's release and rise in popularity, drug companies began mass-distributing and marketing other anti-anxiety medications. This era is when the "happy pill" crisis reached its highest prominence and when most of the ads we're familiar with were popular. Some of these drugs include Butisol, Serax, Thorazine, Mellaril, Ritain, Triavil, Miltown, Mornindine, Valium, and Haldal. Most of these are benzodiazepines (colloquially, "benzos") designed to treat feelings of anxiety, depression, fatigue, obsession, and panic. They are primarily sedatives and would help users "take the edge off."
